#### ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY POLICY AND PROCEDURES

#### Introduction

We aim for an environment which enables and encourages all the students to reach out for excellence. For our children, to gain the greatest benefit from their education, it is vital that they attend school regularly. Your child should be in school, on time, every day unless the reason for the absence is unavoidable.

The school has targets to improve attendance and each student has an important part to play in meeting these targets. Our target is to achieve 98% attendance which is rated as outstanding by the KHDA. Good attendance is the key to successful schooling and high attainment.

# Students are required to swipe their RFID cards in the morning on the machines available at both the gates (# 2 & # 5) to register their attendance.

Students leaving the school premises before the scheduled end of day have to swipe their cards at gate # 2.

#### **Punctuality Procedures:**

It is important for your child to contribute to improving attendance at the school, as it is one of our targets.

We aim to achieve an outstanding 98% attendance rating by the KHDA, which is crucial for successful learning and high achievement.

#### Primary

To ensure a smooth start to the day, it is important to be on time for school and ready to learn. Missing only a few minutes or starting the day 'running late' can be quite unsettling and make a child anxious. School starts at 7:40 am. If a student arrives between 7:40 am and 7:50 am, their Form Teacher will mark them as late. However, if a student arrives after 7:50 am, they must report to the reception to obtain a late pass and be marked as present before attending normal classes. If a child is late more than two times a week, the parents will be requested to attend a meeting with SLT to discuss the matter.

#### Secondary

Dubai Gem expects students to be present in their Form room during the Registration period, which starts at 7:40 am. If a student arrives between 7:40 am and 7:50 am, their Form tutor will mark them as late. However, if a student arrives after 7:50 am, they must report to the Secondary School Secretary to obtain a late pass and be marked as present before attending normal classes. Frequent or unexplained lateness will result in sanctions, which are listed below:

If a student is late four times in two weeks, they will be given detention:

1) You will receive an email informing you of your child's detention and the date.

2) The KSL will give after-school detention on Thursdays from 2:35 pm to 3:15 pm.

Excused lateness can be granted for unavoidable appointments through advanced notification to the KSL.

Poor punctuality is unacceptable, as it can cause your child to miss important work and information from their form tutor. Late-arriving students can also disrupt lessons, be embarrassing for the child, and encourage absence.

We ask that you avoid collecting children from school during school hours and/or before the end of the day as it is disruptive and key learning can be missed. Parents are requested to make all appointments (e.g. medical/dental/ophthalmic appointments) outside of school hours or during school holidays/weekends. If such appointments are unavoidable, parents should send an email to the SLT in advance.

### The School Curriculum

#### **DGPS CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION**

#### **Curriculum Philosophy**

At school, we believe that the curriculum is a powerful tool that should be used to promote a love of learning and willingness to explore and the time to have fun. Our curriculum reflects our understanding that students learn best when they can connect to what they are learning and where learning is relevant to real life.

#### EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE CURRICULUM

#### Foundation Stage 1 (FS1) and Foundation Stage 2 (FS2)

#### Ages: 3 years to 5 years

The Early Years Foundation Stage comprises Foundation Stage 1 and Foundation Stage 2. Initiation into the school through fun-filled and stimulating activities by caring teachers helps each student to view schooling very positively, an attitude that contributes immensely towards developing lifelong learning skills.

This ensures that the transition from home to school is easy and enjoyable. Learning in a safe, secure, and happy environment leads to healthy social and interactive skills, greater self-esteem and good development of cognitive and motor abilities.

The key areas of learning and development covered at this stage will be:

- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

The new Early Years programme in the Foundation Stage ensures that children are suitably prepared for literacy and numeracy. Phonic methods and well-graded writing patterns follow a comprehensive foundation-building programme focusing on enhancing skills in reading, speaking writing and listening. Children in the Foundation Stage mainly learn by playing and exploring, being active and creative learners both indoors and outdoors.

Activities for children are planned around the 7 areas of learning according to the needs and interests of children. The focus is on both individual as well as group activities.

Arabic Language: Students in the Foundation Stage are introduced to the Arabic language and dedicated lessons delivered by Arabic specialists take place from FS2.

By the end of the Foundation Stage, children will be confident and comfortable in the school environment and have basic knowledge of core concepts in order to prepare them to begin the National Curriculum of England

#### THE PRIMARY SCHOOL

#### Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and Year 2) and Key Stage 2 (Year 3 to Year 6)

Ages: 5 years old to 11 years old

The National Curriculum of England provides students with an introduction to the essential knowledge that they need to be educated citizens. It introduces students to the best that has been thought and said; and helps engender an appreciation of human creativity and achievement. It has a very structured flow of learning that challenges and assesses students to ensure development in key academic areas is being met. It provides an outline of core knowledge around which teachers develop exciting and stimulating lessons to promote the development of pupils' knowledge, understanding and skills as part of the wider school curriculum.

This curriculum is distinguished by two **Key Stages** in the Primary: Key Stage 1 which contains the Programmes of Study for Year 1 & 2, and Key Stage 2 which contains the Programmes of Study for Years 3-6.

**Key Stage 1**: As your child moves into KS1, they will continue to experience play-based learning and, in addition, will be introduced to our more formal curriculum so that they can begin to understand their learning in more depth. We have a stimulating learning environment, both inside and outside, in order to encourage role play, problem solving, creative play and independent learning.

It isn't just repeating what someone else says. Encouraging children to help with the purchasing of small items at the supermarket, or measuring themselves and others, is a great way to start exploring number relationships in Key Stage 1.

#### Key Stage 2

In Key Stage 2 we will build upon the solid foundations laid in Key Stage 1, with the main focus being to expose students to a broader range of topics in order to better inform their choices when continuing their education in later years. The curriculum provides the structure for students to develop their questioning skills to enable them to broaden their research and investigate with greater precision, develop techniques in collaborative working and independent study, as well as educating them in a well-rounded manner and giving them a chance to develop lifelong interests and skills. Use of technology is a major component in enhancing students independent learning skills. The school focuses on equipping our students with the required skills needed at each Year level in order to meet the age-related expectations. For instance, in Maths, there will be more focus on mental Maths strategies. You are requested to encourage these skills in your children and to help them understand the application of Maths in the real world.

The focus of our curriculum in both the Key Stages is based on two principles: the first being to relate all learning to Real-Life and the second is for Student Involvement in their learning. Through the integration of technology, students are given a myriad of learning opportunities to develop their 'skills', which include the ability to apply knowledge, think creatively and problem-solve; the ability to express oneself articulately; the ability to persevere and develop self-confidence; the ability to collaborate with others, and the ability to learn. We aim to improve our students' critical, creative, rigorous thinking to develop higher order thinking skills, improve communication skills and help children learn to cooperate with others. Children are encouraged to reflect before speaking so that they are accurate in what they really want to say.

In these years of school, students lay a solid foundation for learning that they will use for the rest of their lives.

- Islamic Education (in Arabic and in English)
- Arabic for Arabs
- Arabic for Non-Arabs
- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- MSCS (which includes Moral Education (Year 2 onwards) and UAE Social Studies)
- Geography
- History
- Personal Social Health Education (PSHE)
- Computing
- Physical Education (PE)
- Art
- Music/Dance
- MFL (Modern Foreign Language) French /Urdu/Hindi (Year 3 onwards)

STEM lessons in Years 5 & 6 add value to students' learning.

Within the Primary, academics is integrated with opportunities to enable students to achieve their full potential and develop skills of reasoning, problem-solving and creative thinking. Learning ensures that all of our students are enthused by what they are learning, and our teachers are passionate about what they are teaching.

Students pursue academic and non-academic prospects through various activities. Socially preferred behaviour patterns are inculcated through a focus on etiquette and values that will lay the foundation for students' social interaction and development.

Key stage 2 students are provided with the opportunities to develop their leadership skills by sharing class and school responsibilities that nurture organisational skills, accountability and team spirit.

The Primary School is the stage of enhanced learning, where the students are constantly evolving and growing, intellectually and emotionally.

Students in Key Stage 1 (Year 2) and Key Stage 2 prepare for the UAE International Benchmark assessments as prescribed by the KHDA, which include CAT4 (selected year groups), GL-Progress Tests, NGRT (3 times a year) and IBT for Arabic.

#### **Clubs & Activities**

Students have the opportunity to choose from a slew of clubs which include Drama and Theatre, Health and Wellbeing, Threads and Needles, Dance, Music, Art, Japanese Culture Club and Junior Reporters. These clubs are reviewed at the end of the academic year and may change depending on students interests and preferences. This approach enables students to explore and tap their talents and interests, as well as to experience different activities throughout the academic year.

Additionally, students are given opportunities to take part in a number of competitions such as International Olympiads, STEM Olympiads and competitions, Emirates Literature festival, Mathematics competitions, and others.

#### Junior Duke Award

Junior Duke Award is an award-winning scheme being offered at DGPS for primary-aged children from Years 3 to 6 to encourage and develop valuable life skills. This Award has been running in schools since 2007 and has helped thousands of children aged 6 to 12 to realise their abilities and, for some, to discover new talents and passions. With the introduction of this award the aim of DGPS is to enhance the overall learning experience for our KS2 students.

#### **Payment Details and Methods:**

- The school fees are due prior to the start of the academic year and payable at the start of each term. Please note, all fees are in accordance with the fee structure established by Dubai Gem Private School under the guidance of KHDA established School Fee Framework.

#### **Receipts:**

The Accounts Department will generate a receipt for payments and it will be available on the Parent Portal.

#### Withdrawal:

• A 'Leaving Certificate request' must be submitted online through the parent portal to formally notify the school about your child leaving. There is a fee of AED 150 for all students transferring within Dubai to another school, or outside of the Emirate or to another Country.

#### **Refund:**

Fees refunds follow the KHDA bylaws for Private Education. Therefore, if a student withdraws or leaves school for any reason, the refunds will be processed as follows:

- If a student attends school for 2 weeks or less, they will be charged one month's school fees.
- If a student attends school for more than 2 weeks and less than one month, they will be charged 2 months' school fees.
- If a student attends school for one month or more, they will be charged 3 months' school fees.
- Tuition will be refunded only after the parent or guardian has submitted the request in writing to the school admissions office. Tuition refunds are provided to the original payee.

Refundable deposit paid at the time of registering the student should be collected within 5 years of the student leaving the school.

### **Transport Services**

The students transport has been outsourced to Guardian One Passenger Transport company. Transport is provided to various areas within Dubai.

All the drivers and nannies follow the guidelines laid out by RTA for school buses. They have also taken all the necessary training required to efficiently take care of the students who commute to school by bus. All safety protocols are followed in line with the list of rules and regulations shared by the RTA / KHDA.

### Canteen Services

M/S Caesars Restaurant and Confectionary have been given the contract to run the school canteen w.e.f. January 2023. This was a milestone since the canteen had been closed since March 2020 due to the pandemic.

The canteen is being run by trained staff from the service provider and is serving food in line with the Dubai Municipality protocols. The school also has a trained person-in-charge from the school clinic who is designated to constantly check on the services being provided by the vendor. List of students with allergies has been shared with the person in charge and are kept in mind by the staff.

### Lanyard Policy

#### **General Guidelines for School Parents**

#### 1. Signing in with Security Staff

All Parents/Visitors who intend to access the school premises must have to pass through the security post at the main entrance to provide purpose of his visit and to complete the signing in process.

- Tell him/her who you are
- Tell him/her why you are there
- Show your identification
- Who you are visiting
- Sign the visitor's book (if needed)
- Comply with all necessary requirements for access to a school as informed by the security staff
- Wear and display your IDs at all times while visiting the school
- Deposit any of the following original valid IDs: (not required if Emirates ID card reader is available at each premises) Driving license, Emirates ID card (UAE only), Labour card or Any other ID issued by the Government

#### 2. Access control (to be implemented)

- Security staff will inspect the school approved ID lanyard and Badge on the main gate before granting access to the premises.
- Parents failing to bring their ID lanyard/badge will go through the visitors' access process (explained under this document # 1) to seek access in the premises.
- Security team at the school will conduct the access control checks to ensure compliance and will challenge anyone not wearing and displaying their ID.
- Confronters will be escorted to the exit gate and requested to leave the school premises.

#### 3. Student I.D Cards

- In order to ensure identification and safeguarding, all students must carry and wear the student I.D. cards to gain access to the school premise.
- Student have to swipe the ID at the biometric meter to register their clock-in and clock-out of the school premises.
- School staff will inspect the school approved ID and lanyard on the main gates before granting access to the premises.
- Comply with all necessary requirements for access to a school as informed by the security staff.
- It is expected from students to wear and display your ID at all times.
